1. Getting the Story line


- a. Can you tell the story of Exodus in your own words?

Think about each big section

Ch 1-2	The Rescued rescuer
Ch 3-4	The burning bush
Ch 5-10	Plagues
Ch 11-15	Passover and the Red Sea
Ch 16-18	A hungry and thirsty people
Ch 19-24	The Law
Ch 25-40:33	Signs and symbols of God's presence
Ch 32-44	Rebellion,
Ch 40:34-38	The glory of God

- a. What is happening in terms of Covenant Promise themes (think Genesis 12:1-3)



- b. What is happening in terms of Creation and Fall themes?
 - i. The God who forms and fills creation (Gen 1)
 - ii. The blessing/creation mandate -multiply and fill the earth
 - iii. Sin -leading to death (exile and slavery as a type of death)
- c. What is happening in terms of echoes and types?

Types are things that point forward and foreshadow

- i. Think about ways in which the events in Exodus are foreshadowed (clue Moses is placed in an “ark” in water, the “ark” is pitched with tar.)
 - ii. Think about ways in which the Events places and symbols in Exodus foreshadow future events, people and places. Think particularly of how the New Testament picks up on some of these things (Jesus is the true and better...)
